



Six Spectacular Sessions

Schools can choose from a morning or an afternoon session; each session lasts 90 minutes. Sessions take place at **10.00am to 11.30am** or **12.30pm to 2.00pm**. We offer a choice of six sessions designed to fit in with the Primary Framework for literacy and the Secondary National Strategy. All sessions include an introductory talk about Roald Dahl and time in the Museum to explore the galleries. The sessions are rounded off with a workshop, details of the choices are listed below together with the suggested age range.



Wordplay by Dahl's Chickens (or is it Charles Dickens?)

Pupils will look at the ways Roald Dahl played with rhyme and humour and created his own Gobblefunk language. They will make up their own nonsensical vocabulary using examples from Roald Dahl's works as inspiration.

Crocky-Wock's Creative Characters

Just like Roald Dahl, pupils will use pictures of people as a starting point to create and bring to life their own bogtrotting baddy or gloriumptious goody. They will also discover more about the characters who never made it into Roald Dahl's published books.

Revolting Recipes for Rascally Writers

Pupils will look at the ingredients needed to write a story by searching the galleries for clues. They will also learn how today's top authors write before creating a recipe for writing a story of their own.

Matilda's Top Tips

Pupils will find out how some of the best-loved children's authors get their good ideas for stories. They will use the props and displays around the galleries and in Miss Honey's Classroom to help find fantabulous ideas to defeat the scary blank page.

Biography of a Boazer

Pupils will look at different events in Roald Dahl's exciting life and explore his writing hut to allow them to piece together a biography of this great storyteller, one of their heroes or even write an autobiography of their own.

Tales of the Unexpected

Pupils will discover the aspects of Roald Dahl's childhood and adult life which inspired the ideas for many of his stories. They will use events from their own lives to begin to create their own tale with a twist.
