Museum guided countryside walks

During the school holidays and on some weekends the Museum offers guided walks.

- The walks usually take between 45mins to 60mins.
- The walks are themed around Roald Dahl's stories.
- The countryside walk is unsuitable for pushchairs or wheelchairs and is on a mixture of paved and uneven paths or grass.
- We do offer a village walk that is wheel friendly.



Museum guided countryside walks

The walks are led by a member of staff.

- The name of the guide is Michael.

During the walks Michael will talk about things you will see.

- He might ask questions.
- You can ask Michael questions.
- He might read short sections of stories.
- He might invite you to follow or copy his actions.
- It's fine if you don't want to do this.

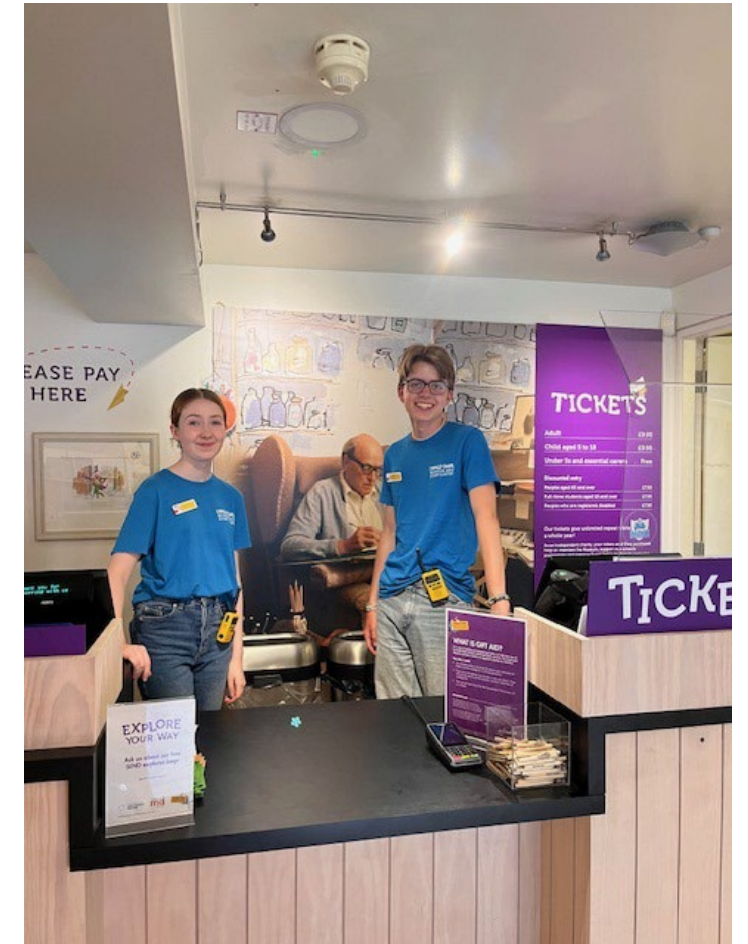

The start of your walk

All guided walks start and finish at the Museum.

- When you arrive the staff at the Ticket Desk will let you know where to meet Michael.
- It will normally be at the purple Wonka Gates or the statue of Matilda.

What to expect on the Countryside Trail

You will cross over the road outside the Museum. This road is called the High Street.

- There might be traffic.
- There might be noise from cars and people on the High Street.

What to expect on the Countryside Trail

You will walk through a narrow alleyway.

- It might be cool in here.
- It might be darker than the footpath.

What to expect on the Countryside Trail

You will walk through a narrow railway tunnel.

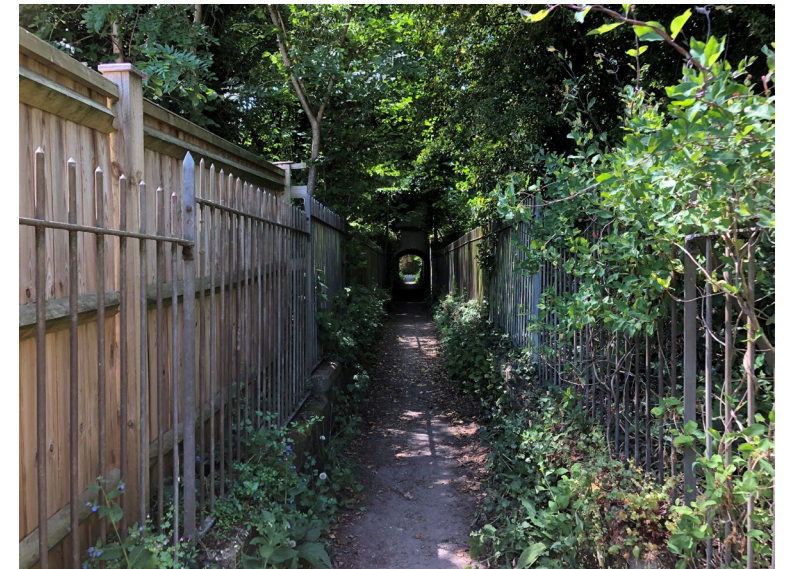
- It might be cool in here.
- It might be darker than the footpath.
- Sound might echo.
- It might smell different.
- It might feel damp.

You will pause in or near to the tunnel.

- It is fine if you do not want to stay inside the tunnel.
- Michael might pause here to talk about a connection to Roald Dahl or his stories.



What to expect on the Countryside Trail

You will walk along gravel paths and through metal gates.

- The path might sound crunchy.
- The path might feel bumpy under your feet.
- The gates might feel cold.
- The gates might squeak when they open.
- The gates might make a loud noise when they close.
- Michael might pause here to talk about Roald Dahl or his stories.

What to expect on the Countryside Trail

You will walk through fields.

- The path might sound crunchy.
- The path might feel bumpy under your feet.
- The path might be grass or soil.
- The path might be muddy.
- You might see or hear other people.
- You might see or hear dogs.

The end of your walk

The walk loops back to the Museum along similar or the same paths as you started on.

Michael will walk with you until you are back at the Museum.

The walk ends back at the Museum.
