Museum guided village walks

During the school holidays and on some weekends the Museum offers guided walks.

- The walks usually take between 45mins to 60mins.
- The village walk is wheel friendly and is mainly on paved or gravel paths.
- We also offer a countryside walk, but this isn't suitable for buggies or wheelchairs.
- The walks are themed around Roald Dahl's stories.

Museum guided village walks

The walks are led by a member of staff.

- The name of the guide is Michael.

During the walks Michael will talk about things you will see.

- He might ask questions.
- You can ask Michael questions.
- He might read short sections of stories.
- He might invite you to follow or copy his actions.
- It's fine if you don't want to do this.

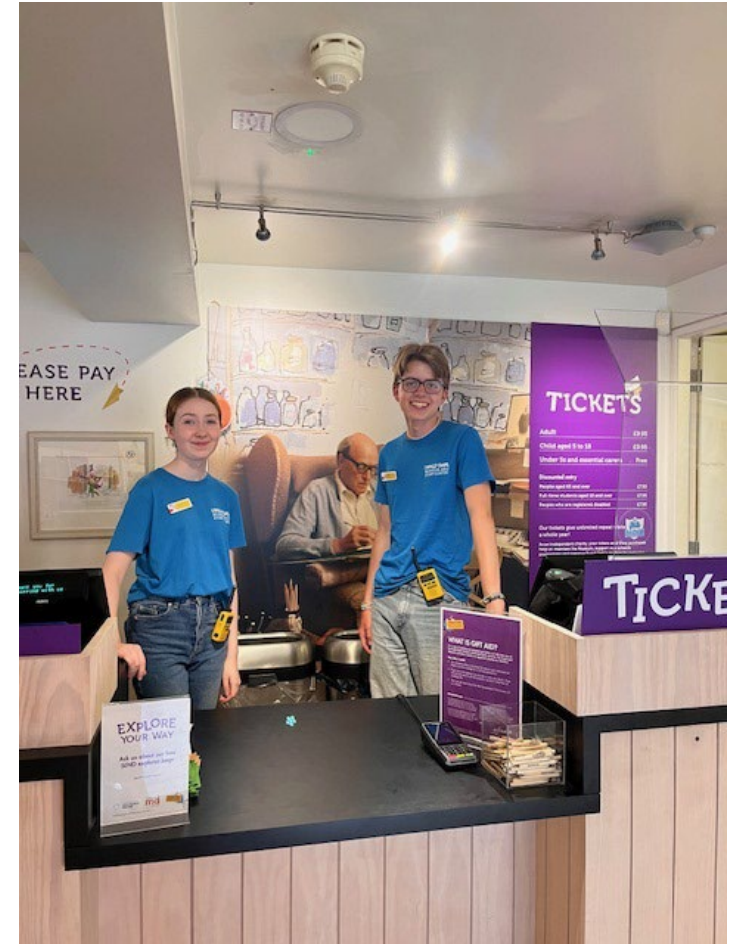

The start of your walk

All guided walks start and finish at the Museum.

- When you arrive the staff at the Ticket Desk will let you know where to meet Michael.
- It will normally be at the purple Wonka Gates or the statue of Matilda.

What to expect on the Village Walk

During the walk you will walk along pavements next to the road. This is called the High Street.

- There might be traffic.
- There might be noise from cars and people on the High Street.

What to expect on the Village Walk

You will pass lots of interesting buildings.

- Michael will pause outside some buildings to talk about their connection to Roald Dahl.
- A lot of the buildings are private homes so we mustn't touch them or look in the windows.



What to expect on the Village Walk

Michael will pause outside Great Missenden Library.

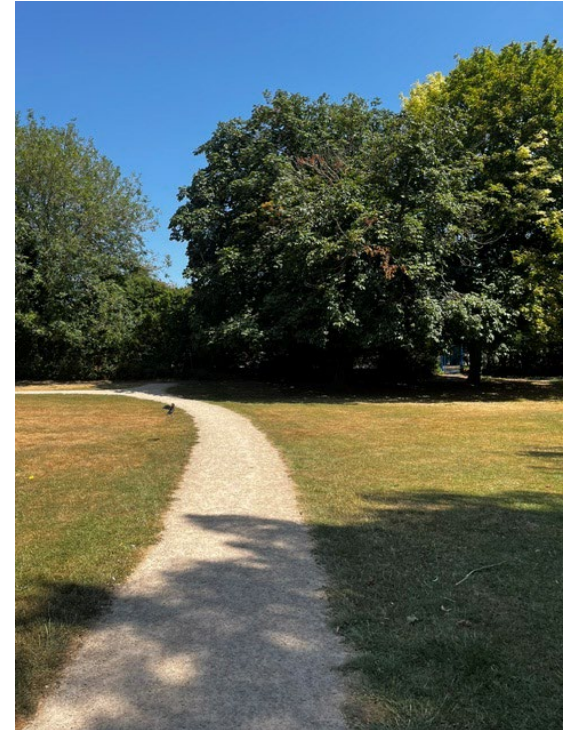
There is an outside bench here if any visitors need a short rest.



What to expect on the Village Walk

During the walk you will go through the playing field called Buryfields.

- The path is a gravel path.
- The path might sound crunchy.
- The playing field has a lot of grass.
- The playing field has lovely trees.
- You might hear people.
- You might see people.
- You might see or hear dogs.
- You might stop under a tree to listen to *Michael*.
- There are benches in the park if a visitor needs to sit for a short while.



What to expect on the Village Walk

You will walk back to the Museum along a quiet and pretty street called Church Street.

- You might see cars.
- You might hear traffic.
- You might see people.
- A lot of the buildings are private homes so we mustn't touch them or look in windows.
- Michael might ask you questions about what you can see. It's fine if you don't want to say anything.



The end of your walk

You will walk back to the Museum along similar paths.

Michael will walk with you until you are back at the entrance to the Museum.

The walk ends back at the Museum.
