





There are two toilets next the entrance.






Toilets










Museum Café Kiosk - The Filling-Station




Corridor area with sink



In the event of an emergency:

In the unlikely event of an emergency our staff will help and guide you in what to do. What you are asked to do will be different depending on the type of emergency.



In these situations, you might:

hear a loud siren or alarm.





• be asked by a member of staff or the emergency services to leave the museum via a fire exit.





• be asked to wait somewhere specific by a member of staff or the emergency services.





• not be able to go into certain parts of the museum or go into the museum. This might mean you must leave your belongings behind.
